"Safe or Not Safe?"



**NOT SAFE** 

Help kids practice thinking through online choices by sorting actions into "Safe" or "Not Safe" categories. This game builds awareness, encourages discussion, and helps kids understand how to stay safe online.

## How to Play:

- Cut out the action cards.
- Lay the two category labels on the floor or table: SAFE and NOT SAFE.
- Read each card aloud or let the child read.
- Ask your child to place the card in the correct category.
